

Work in the Transport and Logistics sector is about moving goods from one place to another and making sure that they get to the right people on time. There are also jobs that involve the transport of people. It includes rail, road, sea, and air industries, and companies who pay for their goods to be carried like retailers and manufacturers. You could work for postal, delivery, transport and rail freight companies, in airports, sea ports and warehouses, and for supermarkets and retail chains. You can do apprenticeships from level 2 up to level 6.
